

scholarship is available to a high school senior
living in Monroe County or have lived in Monroe

short course or vocational-technical college
program that will not result in a baccalaureate
degree. Must be under 23 years of age as of

Statewide Educational Experiences Scholarships

Thanks to generous support from the 4-H Foundation, a pool of funds for youth to participate in Statewide Educational Experiences is available. This money will be given out as needs-based scholarships for youth to participate in a variety of programs including travel, leadership, arts,

and animal science opportunities. This funding is separate from any County scholarship that they may apply for, and any youth who is participating in a Statewide Educational Experience may apply. If you are on the fence about registering for an event because of financial need, this may be for you! Scholarships that are awarded from this fund will directly reduce the cost of the registration fee for youth. For example, if someone owes \$350 to participate in Summer Academy and is awarded a \$100 scholarship from this fund, the invoice for that youth will reflect that and their amount owed will be reduced to \$250.
