Wisconsin 4-H Policies

Wisconsin 4-H operates within the guidelines, policies and procedures of the University of Madison Division of Extension and the United States Department of Agriculture. These policies are established to ensure the educational and administrative

In addition to the insurance coverage provided by the UW Madison to enrolled 4-H members and certified adult volunteers, your club may want to take out extra insurance for a special activity. For example, when Shooting Sports puts on an archery program, we get extra insurance through American Income Life Insurance, Special Risk Division. It's very affordable, usually around \$0.30 per person. So, if your club plans on going skiing, sledding, or ice skating, etc., you may want to get this insurance. Leaders can fill out a form at https://www.ailife.com/specialriskdivision/ activityreport and submit it a few days BEFORE the

event. You do not have to know the exact number of participants, just an estimate (including adults). AFTER the activity, submit the form with the actual number of participants. The minimum fee per event is \$8.00. If you prefer the office to submit this form, just give us a call at 608-269-8722.

Your membership and profile information will roll over, but your projects will not. Below are instructions on how to log into the system.

- 1. Go to https://wi.4honline.com.
- 2. Enter your email address and password.
- 3. Click Sign-In.
- 4. You will be at the Family Member List Screen.

5. To re-enroll a Youth member, click on Enroll Now, then click member's Grade, and continue through the screens.

6. To re-enroll an Adult member, click on Enroll Now then click Select Volunteer Type to indicate how you are planning to participate. Continue through the screens.


ATTENTION: LAST NEWSLETTER !!!



The 4-H American Spirit Experience is an opportunity for youth 8-10 grades to experience history & heritage by immersing in a 10-day bus journey to the East Coast and Canada. Staff and volunteers plan and facilitate the experience, with youth participants leading content throughout the experience. Participants increase their knowledge of American history while experiencing where it occurred and have unique opportunities for dynamic exposure to diverse cultural experiences and perspectives of the foundation of our nation, all while developing positive relationships with adults and their peers from around the state.

American Spirit Experience Objectives for its Participants:

- Increase knowledge and understanding of America's heritage
- Build awareness of the many steps taken to gain U.S. independence and freedom
- · Further develop skills in leadership and personal expression of values
- · Increase awareness of self in relationship to others
- Share what was learned with others in your club and county

Participant Eligibility

- All youth grades 8-10
- Pre-Registration in 4H Online 2.0 is open starting October 1-November 15, 2023. Youth and their
 parent/guardian must complete the online registration together; it includes questions for the youth
 participant to answer!
- Each experience is limited to 44 youth. Decisions about who is selected to travel are based on the following factors: # of youth per experience, full rooms by identified gender, ages of youth traveling together, and eligibility to participate in future years. The committee does take into account registration dates and times.
- Estimated Cost of Experience = \$1,900 Invoices will be sent to each county starting December 1, 2023. At that time, checks NEED to be written out to 4-H American Spirit and NOT Sheboygan County or Extension!
