Fair Wrap Up Reminders

- Remember to cash or deposit your fair checks as soon as possible.
- For those of you who have livestock checks, please distribute your pictures, get your picture delivery verification form signed and pick up your check at the Extension Office as soon as possible.

2025 4-H Enrollment

Enrollment for the 2024-2025 4-H year begins September 1st. The State will shut down the system on August 31st for updates and it should be back up and running on September 1st. Your membership and profile information will roll over, but your projects will not. Below are instructions on how to log into the system.



- 1. Go to https://wi.4honline.com.
- 2. Enter your email address and password.
- 3. Click Sign-In.
- 4. You will be at the Family Member List Screen.

5. To re-enroll a Youth member, click on Enroll Now, then click member's Grade, and continue through the screens.

6. To re-enroll an Adult member, click on Enroll Now then click Select Volunteer Type to indicate how you are planning to participate. Continue through the screens.

FAQ About 4-H

- Is signing up for 4-H the same as signing up for Fair?
 > No. The 4-H program and fair are two separate entities.

 What's the difference between 4-H and Fair?
 > 4-H is an educational youth organization that members need to enroll in every year through a software program called 4HOnline. Projects and activities are done all year long.

Fair is a yearly, 6-day event, run by the Monroe County Ag Society. Registration is through an online software program called BlueRibbon. To be eligible to enter in the Junior Fair, you must be a member of a youth organization.

- Do I have to enter the Fair if I am in a 4-H club?

> No. Fair is not a requirement of 4-H membership. The Fair is a place where you can show off your 4-H projects that you worked on during the year.

- When is the last date I can enroll in 4-H to be eligible to exhibit at the Fair? > **NOVEMBER 15, 2024 - this date is earlier than previous years.**



Arts Camp

At Arts Camp, you will be immersed in a world of arts activities. You can try your hand at various Expressive Arts, including Drawing, Painting, Theater, Dance, Culinary, and Music. This is your opportunity to explore new artistic territories. But that's not all! Arts Camp is also about having a blast with activities like a talent show. Gnome hunt, color group competitions, and much more.

Arts Camp is an overnight event at Upham Woods in the Wisconsin Dells, October 5-6. Campers arrive Saturday morning and wrap up with events in the early afternoon on Sunday. This is a great way to enjoy the outdoors and the arts all at the same time.

All payments are confidential and all youth will receive the same great Arts Camp experience.

What does this mean?

We value and encourage participation in the arts, and it is difficult to put a price on youth programming. As we prioritize keeping this event affordable for families by offering three pricing options, \$120 closely represents direct costs for arts camp programming but doesn't truly account for continued program growth. Thank you for paying what you can to make future 4-H youth programming possible for all Wisconsin youth. Adult chaperone registration fees are \$60.








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We are excited to offer the Advanced Space Academy next year for youth in grades 10-12. Advanced Space Academy is a weeklong educational experience where youth will travel to Huntsville, AL via coach bus and get the opportunity to train like an astronaut, learn team building skills at the Space Camp Challenge Course, participate in SCUBA diving at the underwater astronaut trainer, and learn a ton more about Space and STEM!

This year, Wisconsin 4-H is traveling to Advanced Space Academy from February 15-22, 2025. The total cost for participants is \$2,700 per youth. The cost includes travel, meals, lodging, and programming costs. Some state scholarships are available to help offset costs (see the website below). Youth will travel via coach bus and will stay in the dormitories at Space Camp with the exception of the first and last nights being at a hotel in route to Space Camp. **Registration will be open in 4HOnline from September 4-30th, 2024** for youth in grades 10-12 for the 2024-2025 4-H year. Additionally, there is a minimum number of youth participants of 36 - if this experience does not reach the minimum number of participants, it will be cancelled.
