2025 4-H Enrollment

Your membership and profile information will roll over, but your projects will not. Below are instructions on how to log into the system.



- 1. Go to https://wi.4honline.com.
- 2. Enter your email address and password.
- 3. Click Sign-In.
- 4. You will be at the Family Member List Screen.
- 5. To re-enroll a Youth member, click on Enroll Now, then click member's Grade, and continue through the screens.
- 6. To re-enroll an Adult member, click on Enroll Now then click Select Volunteer Type to indicate how you are planning to participate. Continue through the screens.

The greeting cards are getting printed this week and will go on sale midlate November. The cards will make great Christmas presents for anyone! Watch the website and Facebook page for details.


Project News & Information

Science & Fair Project: Leaf Collection

Have you ever wondered why leaves change color? Ever wondered what kind of trees make certain leaves or seeds?



November is a great time to collect fallen leaves and complete a Leaf Collection Project to enter at the Fair: Department 16- Natural Science, Class C- Forestry

Here is the science of why leaves change color to help get your project started!

Leaf color comes from pigments. Pigments are natural substances produced by leaf cells. The three pigments that color leaves are:

- chlorophyll (green);
- · carotenoid (yellow, orange, and brown); and
- anthocyanin (red).

Chlorophyll is the most important of the three. Without the chlorophyll in leaves, trees wouldn't be able to use sunlight to produce food. Carotenoids create bright yellows and oranges in familiar fruits and vegetables. Corn, carrots, and bananas are just a few of the many plants colored by carotenoids. Anthocyanins add the color red to plants, including cranberries, red apples, cherries, strawberries, and others.

Chlorophylls and carotenoids are in leaf cells all the time during the growing season. But the chlorophyll covers the carotenoid - that's why summer leaves are green, not yellow or orange. Most anthocyanins are produced only in autumn, and only under certain conditions. Not all trees can make anthocyanin.

Here are the common native trees in Wisconsin autumn leaf colors: <u>Oaks</u>- red or brown. <u>Hickories</u>golden bronze. <u>Dogwood</u>-purple/ red. <u>Birch</u>- bright yellow. <u>Poplar</u>- golden yellow. <u>Maples</u>- show a range of colors, <u>Sugar Maple</u>- Orange/Red, <u>Black Maple</u>-glowing yellow, and <u>Red Maple</u>-bright scarlet.

Native American Heritage Month


UW-Madison and Monroe County Extension acknowledge the land we occupy is ancestral Ho-Chunk land, a place their nation has called Teejop (day-JOPE) since time immemorial. In an 1832 treaty, the Ho-Chunk were forced to cede this territory. Decades of ethnic cleansing followed when both the federal and state governments repeatedly, but unsuccessfully, sought to forcibly remove the Ho-Chunk from Wisconsin. We acknowledge the circumstances that led to the forced removal of the Ho-Chunk people and honor their legacy of resistance and resilience. This history of colonization informs our work and vision for a collaborative future. We recognize and respect the inherent sovereignty of the Ho-Chunk Nation and the other 11 Native Nations within the boundaries of the state of Wisconsin.

The Ho-Chunk, also known as Hocak, Hoocagra, or Winnebago are a Siouan-speaking Native American people whose historic territory includes parts of Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, and Illinois. Today, Ho-Chunk people are enrolled in two federally recognized tribes, the Ho-Chunk Nation of Wisconsin and the Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska. Historically, the surrounding Algonquin tribes referred to them by a term that evolved to Winnebago, which was later used as well as by the French and English. The Ho-Chunk Nation has always called themselves Ho-Chunk. The name Ho-Chunk comes from the word Hocaagra (Ho meaning "voice", cak meaning "sacred", ra being a definitive article) meaning "People of the Sacred Voice". Their name comes from oral traditions that state they are the originators of the many branches of the Siouan language.

The Ho-Chunk oral tradition states "We have always been here" and more than likely, we always be here. Our history is not told in history books, but spans back beyond possibly three ice ages.

"Hocqk Wazijacira Hižqkiišqnq Hįįnį Karagiwinq" -The Ho-Chunk Nation greets each and every one of you.







DUPPET TIME!
